Suspension of Patient Visitation

Due to the unprecedented surge in cases of COVID-19 pandemic, WVU Medicine Uniontown Hospital is suspending all patient visitation.

An exception will be made for **end-of-life situations** as identified by medical staff. A visitor that meets this exception will be stopped at the hospital entrance, be screened for symptoms, be provided with a mask and an identification badge by WVU Medicine Uniontown Hospital Main Entrance staff, and then be directed to the designated area of the hospital.

WVU Medicine Uniontown Hospital respectfully asks for your full cooperation during this challenging time. The COVID-19 pandemic is best handled through limiting exposure for everyone and preventing transmission of the disease and the safety of our patients, staff and community is our priority. We recognize the significance of this step and the challenges and hardships it will present; however, we feel it is necessary to ensure the best possible health for our patients and our employees. We also encourage the families and patients that may be impacted by these restrictions to please maintain contact in other ways, including by video, phone and email when possible to aid in the recovery process.
